WYOMING BRED AWARD PROGRAM

Wyoming bred horses are the only horses that qualify for points awarded by the Wyoming Breeders Program and administered by the Wyoming Pari-Mutuel Commission. Points are accumulated annually throughout the race season according to a horse's placement in each of the races it runs during that season.

Funds for the award program result from Wyoming's wagering events, including simulcast, live wagering, advanced deposit wagering and the Historic Racing industry. According to state legislation these wagering events contribute a percentage of annual earnings to Wyoming Horsemen programs.

The development of the Wyoming Bred Awards Program and its value to Wyoming breeders can be tracked by the growth in the sizes of the cumulative awards:

The Wyoming Bred Breeders Award Program paid out a \$2,324,853.89 in 2018 to 106 awardees that were eligible for owners, breeders and stallion owners of Accredited Wyoming Breds that ran throughout Wyoming, including 7 individuals earning triple digit numbers as high money earners through the program, including top awardee Mike Lipp-Greybull, WY (\$178,508.27), Gerald Kaul-Sheridan, WY (\$166,583.01), the KC Carden Estate-Sheridan, WY (\$164,210.77), Broken Bones Cattle Co., John & Marie Whipp-Lander, WY (\$162,622.85), Ron Moosman-Evanston, WY(\$125,196.50), Daniel & Carol Lee-Riverton, WY (\$122,675.11) and Pedro Mena-Evanston, WY (\$106,504.84).
